To accomplish that, we're recruiting Fellows committed to giving Bronx students the support they need to reach their potential.

Our commitment to the Bronx is longstanding. Currently, 15% of all teachers working in the Bronx are Fellows. One such example is Damen Davis, a 2014 Fellow teaching Special Education in the South Bronx. Damen has never looked back on his original commitment, sharing that "My school is a community. Teaching allows me the opportunity to engage with and be a part of the lives of some of the most promising young people."

## **Special Opportunities for Bronx Cohort Fellows**

As a Bronx Cohort Fellow, you are part of a sub-group of 2017 Summer Cohort Fellows selected to train and teach in the Bronx and will enjoy special benefits within the NYC DOE, including:

- Early Hiring: To meet the high need for teachers, Bronx
  Cohort Fellows will be able to meet with principals before
  citywide hiring officially begins and have the opportunity to
  secure an early hiring commitment from a select group of
  schools in the Bronx.
- Reduced Tuition: While all Fellow's receive a subsidized tuition, Bronx Cohort university tuition in pursuit of a master's degree is further subsidized.
- Networking and Support: Bronx Cohort Fellows will be invited to special school tours, networking events, and hiring events to connect with Bronx principals and representatives.
- Opportunity for Awards: Eligible Bronx Cohort Fellows may be able to take advantage of award programs like Americorps.
