Facebook Guidelines for Use

The Facebook Guidelines and Expectations below provide guidance regarding recommended practices for professional Facebook communication among enrolled Fellows. Before engaging with other cohort members in the group, we ask that you read these guidelines completely in order to effectively engage with other Fellows in the Facebook group.

1. Conduct yourself professionally and respectfully. This group is meant to be a valuable resource for 2017 Fellows, and everyone in the group is dedicated to the mission of the NYC Teaching Fellows.
2. Cyberbullying (i.e. harassment, intimidation, and manipulation) as well as violent, discriminatory, hateful or threatening speech is unacceptable and will not be tolerated.
3. Do not post foul language, vulgar and or violent/unlawful images or videos in this group.
4. Posts aimed at soliciting money, for any reason, are not permitted.
5. Images of student's faces and/or work that identifies a student should not be posted in the Facebook group. Protect sensitive or confidential information.
